
Dance Outs Are Fun!

Upcoming Events

January 24, 2015 – Closed competition run by MHDA at the St. James Civic Centre in Winnipeg, 2055 Ness Ave. Closing date for entries was January 16, 2015. Pre-premier dancers register at 9:00 a.m., dance at 9:30 a.m. Premier dancers register at 12:00 p.m., dance following the morning awards. Good luck to all dancers, especially premier dancers tackling long steps in competition for the first time this season!

January 26, 2015 – Highland dance out at Riverwood Square to help seniors celebrate Robbie Burns Day. Good luck and have fun to all dancers participating!

February 21, 2015 – Open Winnipeg Scottish Fesitval and Championship, run by ScotDance Manitoba, taking place at CanadInns Polo Pork in Winnipeg, 1405 St. Matthews Avenue. Primary and pre-premier events are scheduled for 9:00 a.m., with the first Championship of 2015, the Manitoba Open, set to take place at 1:00 p.m.

February 22, 2015 – Highland dance workshops with the adjudicators from Saturday's competition, plus a yoga classes. Premier championship workshop runs from 12:00 to 2:30 p.m., followed by yoga from 2:30 to 3:30 p.m. The prepremier dancers have an introduction to yoga for children workshop from 1:30 to 2:30 p.m., followed by highland from 2:30 to 4:00 p.m.

Various dates in late February – Medal test exams will be taking place following the February competition. Good luck to all dancers completing exams!

March 14, 2015 – MHDA Open comeptition set to be held at the St. James Civic Centre in Winnipeg. Stay tuned for more details!

April 11, 2015 – ScotDance Manitoba will host an open competition, set to be held at Balmoral Hall in Winnipeg. More details will be released closer to the competition.

May 2, 2015 – Provincial selection meet championship and closed competition, set to be held at the St. James Civic Centre, in Winnipeg. Many dancers are already preparing for this competition!

June 6 & 7, 2015 – The final MHDA competition of the season, Mid-Canada. Saturday is a Championship for premier dancers, and Sunday is the Lord Selkirk Premiership. Both days include pre-premier competitions. A competition that everyone looks forward to, as the venue at the canopy at the Forks in Winnipeg is fun to dance at!
