Our Spring Bud, Spud & Steak is back!

Save the Date of Friday, May 29, 2015 from 6-9pm at the Tijuana Yacht Club Event Centre (TYC) in Canad Inns Polo Park.

The MHDA will once again run a Spring Bud, Spud & Steak fundraiser, but with some changes. This year, the fundraiser is optional and open to all dancers (not just Mb Reps) travelling to the ScotDance Canada Championship Series in London, Ontario in July.

There are multiple ways to participate and earn funds to assist with the expenses of travelling to this prestigious event.

In order to participate, please provide proof of registration (Online entries will open at 1:00 PM EDT on Monday, March 16, 2016at www.sdccs.ca), regardless of dancer classification. Once participation is confirmed, there are 3 ways to earn funds (choose what works for your family):

- 1) Sell tickets: \$10 from each ticket sold goes back to the dancer that sold the ticket (for example, sell 10 tickets, receive \$100). Dancers can sell tickets to friends, family, coworkers, etc whether the are available to attend or not.
- 2) Donate or collect a prize: Provide a minimum of one prize basket in order to receive funds from the Silent Auction. After the silent auction is completed, all proceeds will be divided equally amongst all the dancers providing a minimum of one basket each. Families with multiple dancers must provide a basket from each dancer in order to receive multiple shares. Dancers need not attend to participate, however, you must make your own arrangements to ensure the basket it delivered in time for the event and clearly marked with the donating dancer's name. Anyone requiring a donation request letter, please advise Lisa Omand.
- 3) Perform: Dancers that participate in the Dance-out performance that evening will split the proceeds of the 50/50 draw. (Dancers do not need a ticket to attend for performing only, however, they will not receive a meal and no outside food or drinks are permitted).

Tickets will be available starting at the Scotdance Manitoba competition in April.

DID YOU KNOW?

- That MHDA awards approximately 10 perpetual trophies at each of the October, November, January and March competitions; approximately 15 perpetual trophies at the Provincial Championship in May and approximately 25+ perpetual trophies at the Mid-Canada competition in June.
- ❖ That any given MHDA perpetual trophy is not always awarded every year, depending on the number of dancers and classes in a competition.
- That MHDA perpetual trophies not in circulation are stored in a storage locker rented by MHDA.
- ❖ That YOU can help maintain MHDA perpetual trophies by ensuring that loose name plates are reattached to the trophy, any damage is repaired and the trophy is returned in good condition.
- That YOU can support MHDA by donating new or recycled keeper trophies for upcoming competitions.

March 14, 2015 – MHDA Open comeptition set to be held at the St. James Civic Centre in Winnipeg, 2055 Ness Avenue. Pre-premier dancers register at 9:00 a.m., be ready to dance by 9:30 a.m. Intermediate and Premier dancers register at 12:00 p.m., dance following the morning results.

March 16, 2015 – Entries for SDCCS 2015 in London, Ontario open. The official entry form is expected to be released very soon, check sdccs.ca for details, or Like Scotdance Canada on Facebook!

April 6, 2015 – Tartan Day 2015 at the Forks. Event begins at 5:00 p.m. and will include MHDA, RSCDS and the Lord Selkirk RFM Pipe Band.

April 11, 2015 – ScotDance Manitoba will host an open competition, set to be held at Balmoral Hall in Winnipeg. More details will be released closer to the competition.

April 17, 2015 - Deadline for to apply for the James L McKenzie Scholarship. This is open to Premier dancers, who must submit their application along with a letter of recommendation from their current teacher. Applicants must also perform the Tribute to JL McKenzie dance. There will be opportunities to complete the dance requirement at the March 14 MHDA competition and the April 11 ScotDance Manitoba competition. For more information, please ask your teacher.

April 25 & 26 – Fraser Valley Open Championship, Pre-Championship and Competition in Fort Langley, British Columbia. Regular entries closed on April 10, 2015, but late entries will still be accepted. The entry form notes late entries received after April 17 may not appear in the program. Good luck to any Manitoba dancers making the trip.

May 2, 2015 – Provincial selection meet championship and closed competition, set to be held at the St. James Civic Centre, in Winnipeg. Only 1.5 months away! Entry forms to be circulated shortly.

May 15 – 17, 2015 - Saskatchewan Highland Gathering and Celtic Festival. Two days of competition for dancers, with the Queen City Open Championship on Saturday May 16 and the Prairie Valley Premiership on May 17. Keep an eye for more details, as this is a fun trip for Manitoba dancers!

June 6 & 7, 2015 – The final MHDA competition of the season, Mid-Canada. Saturday is a Championship for premier dancers, and Sunday is the Lord Selkirk Premiership. Both days include pre-premier competitions. A competition that everyone looks forward to, as the venue at the canopy at the Forks in Winnipeg is fun to dance at!
