Message from the President

The Professional

This issue, I would like to focus on some of the most important people to Highland Dance in Manitoba: The professionals.

Teachers are really the builders of Highland Dance. Without teachers to pass on the art to young dancers, it would cease to exist.

Note that I made the title of this message "The Professional" rather than "The Teachers". This is because I want to point out the dedication our teachers have to their own professional development and the development of amateurs.

In Manitoba, our Professionals are members of ScotDance Manitoba. Its membership is comprised of those who have taken the qualifying exams. They may have students or not, but they still maintain their professional status. Other Members are also Adjudicators and/or Examiners. All members contribute to maintaining the high standard of Highland Dance in Manitoba. One goal is to stay current with technical issues and trends in teaching. Any highland dancer can be assured of quality instruction if their teacher is certified and an active member of ScotDance Manitoba. ScotDance Manitoba is an affiliate of ScotDance Canada, the National Body for Highland Dance Professionals in Canada.

M.H.D.A depends on ScotDance Manitoba in many ways. They provide technical advice for our competitions, judge selection, sword stewards, scoring and designing a dance program. They also aid us in putting on events like the Tartan Tea; one of M.H.D.A's most important fundraisers. Many highland dance professionals volunteer or have volunteered their time to serve on the MHDA executive or committees. ScotDance Manitoba represents MHDA as a voting delegate for competition organizers at the ScotDance Canada Annual General Meeting held in conjunction with the Canadian Championship Series. Your professionals also volunteer time to be a part of this executive committee and other committees for ScotDance Canada.

They also contribute to Highland Dance by providing technical advice to non M.H.D.A competitions. They organize other competitions, amateur and professional workshops, medal test examinations and by their dedication to the promotion of their own dance schools, hold activities such as dance camps, workshops and special performances.

Many young dancers and new parents may not realize the depth and significance of these contributions. I hope that by reading this they will have a new appreciation for the Highland Dancing Professional.

I am glad to hear that there are several new young professionals becoming members of Scot Dance Manitoba this year. I am also glad to hear that there are several professional exams being planned for this year. These dancers should be commended for taking the next step in their Highland career. They are the future builders of Highland Dance in Manitoba.

I hope many of our young dancers aspire to become professionals' whether that means becoming a teacher or judge or contributing in other ways.
