Our MHDA Dancers witnessed a real life role model as Colleen McGregor's dreams of a career in theatre are being realized right in front of our eyes. "Nothing great has ever been accomplished without passion" is a mantra that Colleen has lived and passed forward to inspire others. She believes in the capacity for all students of Highland Dance to realize the potential they each hold within themselves to fulfill their dream.

Colleen plays in the theatrical performance as well as in real life a young adult who wishes to create her own destiny and just "be herself." Ariel is the role model for girl power and self-empowerment. Colleen's ability to command the stage, while coupling her "Crystal Clear" soprano voice and dance ability inspire us all to believe that our dreams will become a reality.

One step at a time, Colleen continues to follow her own advice and those of her mentors who have left a positive impression on her life. They have always encouraged her to set new goals. She actively pursues her next leading role, fuelled by mentors: her mother, Gaelyn McGregor; her Grandma, Myrna-Lou McGregor, Marge Koop, Paula Potosky, and Kristen Chenoweth. Colleen plans on "paying it forward," within MHDA, as she in turn mentors many youngsters to enjoy the world of dance. They witness first hand Colleen dancing and singing her way to future leading role ventures. These youngsters give Colleen an extra boost of motivation and inspiration as she channels her energy to focus on realizing her dream of Broadway stardom.

Her passion is performing, therefore the happiest moments are spent on a stage with her cast members and friends. She has a fantastic work ethic that coupled with hard work and perseverance has led to creating opportunities for herself. Colleen is a humble individual who shares, while actively demonstrating her life lesson, "Work hard, then you can play hard," with young dancers and their families. Colleen never lost sight of her goal as she built up an impressive repertoire within the last year starting with CBC's Over the Rainbow Series showcasing Andrew Llyod Weber's search for the next Dorothy. Colleen took a "Leap of Faith" while placing on hold the University of Manitoba's Music program, and was a part of this series. She finished an impressive third runner up position which in turn taught her valuable lessons and opened many other doors. Her recipe of success is certainly to include the 4 R's- risk taking, reanalysis, restructuring and readiness to vie competitively for upcoming roles. Her Highland Dance training has laid a strong foundation to enable Colleen to perform comfortably and confidently on stage. She has mentally prepared for competitive moments since the age of three years. Through utilizing her active listening skills, daily practice, building confidence on a stage and by observing others Colleen has trained well for the "moments" we all witness as a leading lady. Intrinsically, Colleen is reminded daily of why she loves to be center stage!

Colleen, who has the ability to think on her feet/fins quickly, jumped at the chance this summer to include Highland dance moves into the production's choreography. Highland dance has prepared Colleen to pick up choreography including many other dance genres with ease. Basic body awareness and technique required for all forms of dance (pointed toes, turn out, posture) have all been well honed from her extensive training in Highland. Always the team player and mentor Colleen is quick to point out that it is essential to study all forms of dance if you wish to pursue theatre roles. The dance call auditions are often the predecessor to the vocal call-backs and a necessity to rounding off the entirety of a "true" performer. Colleen encourages children to start to set goals based on the reality of their moment as a child with a vision will succeed. As experience warranted Colleen reanalyzed the steps necessary to achieving her dream of preforming in front of "live" audiences.

By pursuing both the leading roles of Dorothy and Ariel, characters that held big dreams for their futures, Colleen has come to represent the fact that "dreams do become a reality!"

November 15, 2014 – MHDA closed competition to be held at Balmoral Hall in Winnipeg, Manitoba. Entries opened on October 18, 2014. They close on November 1, 2014. Don't forget this time premier and intermediate dancers register at 9 a.m., dance at 9:30 a.m. Pre-premier dancers register at 12:30 p.m., dance following morning results.

November 28, 2014 – Dance out opportunity for dancers 16 years and older. It will be at the annual St. Andrew's Men's Society dinner, further time details to follow. MHDA dancers will perform with Graeme McCombe piping for about 15 minutes. Please contact Lauren Mitchell-Lawson at <u>danceouts@mbhighlanddance.com</u> before the end of October to sign up!

December 6, 2014 – The annual fundraising event that every member and alumni looks forward to – the Tartan Tea!
