Change Of Rules From SOBHD For Pre-Premier Dancers

Below is a summary of a change of rules made by SOBHD for Pre-Premier dancers. If you have any questions or concerns please contact your teacher.

CHANGE OF RULE FROM 1ST JANUARY 2016

At the Annual General Meeting of the SOBHD held on Saturday 14th November 2015, the following Rule changes took place: This will affect Beginners, Novice and Intermediate dancers

Page 23 COMPETITION SECTIONS

2. BEGINNERS:

Rule change affecting Beginner dancers registering from 1st January 2016

This status is held until the competitor either a) gains a first, second or third prize in SIX separate Beginner's competitions, or b) until **twelve** months following the first beginners stamp whichever 'a' or 'b' is the later, after which that competitor is classified as a Novice dancer and is not eligible to enter a Beginner's event.

NOTE: Beginner dancers with **PART** of the SIX months remaining, can continue for one year from the date of the first stamp. Beginners stamp for Highland only. Beginner dancers whose SIX months have expired but who have less than six stamps as yet, may continue until all Six stamps are achieved.

3. NOVICE

Rule change affecting Novice dancers registering from 1st January 2016

This status is held until the competitor either a) gains a first, second or third prize in SIX separate Novice competitions, or b) until **twelve** months following the first novice stamp whichever 'a' or 'b' is the later, after which that competitor is classified as an Intermediate dancer and is not eligible to enter a Novice event.

NOTE: Novice dancers with **PART** of the SIX months remaining, can continue for one year from the date of the first stamp. Novice dancers whose SIX months have expired but who have less than six stamps as yet, may continue until all Six stamps are achieved

4. INTERMEDIATE

Rule change affecting Intermediate dancers registering from 1st January 2016

4. INTERMEDIATE: This status is held until the competitor either a) gains a first, second or third prize in SIX separate Intermediate competitions, or b) until twelve months following the first intermediate stamp which ever 'a' or 'b' is the later, after which that competitor is classified as a Premier dancer and is not eligible to enter an Intermediate event.

NOTE: Intermediate dancers registering between now and 1st January 2016 have their start date marked on the back of the card and the year commences from then. E.g. for start dates 1st December 2015 year starts 1 st December 2015. Whereas if start date is 1st January 2016, they will also have a six stamp section on their card.

Canadian Champion Laura UnRuh Recognized At Manitoba Legislature

On November 25th at the Manitoba Legislative Building Laura Unruh, along with her teacher Gaelyn McGregor were honored during Heather Stefanson's (MLA Tuxedo) Private Members' Statement. Here is the Statement:

Mrs. Heather Stefanson (MLA Tuxedo): "I am honoured to rise in the House today to recognize a young Manitoban who brought a Canadian championship home to our province this year. Miss Laura Unruh is a Scottish Highland dancer who began her dance career at the age of four at the McGregor Studio of Dance. In the eight years since stepping onto the stage, Laura has managed to accumulate quite the collection of awards. Beyond the numerous local competitions she has walked away victorious from, she has held the Manitoba and mid-Canada championship title since 2012 and was the eastern Canadian champion in 2014.

This past July, Laura's list of achievements culminated in winning the Canadian championship title in her age category of 10 and under 12 years. The last person, Mr. Speaker, to receive this title in Manitoba was 27 years ago by Jillian Currie, who is also in the gallery with us today.

Following this amazing victory, Laura travelled to Scotland to compete internationally at the world championships, where she received second runner-up in her age category.

Laura's accomplishments are obviously a result of her dedication to and love of dance. This passion has been encouraged and mentored by her incredible dance instructor, Ms. Gaelyn McGregor of McGregor Studio of Dance, the largest competitive Highland dance studio in Manitoba.

This year, Gaelyn not only celebrated Laura's triumph at the Canadians but her own milestone of 40 years of teaching. She is an examiner, fellow and life member of the Scottish Dance Teachers' Alliance and an adjudicator with the Scottish Official Board of Highland Dance. Gaelyn was the first recipient of the Lord Strathcona Award sponsored by the St. Andrew's Society for her tireless contributions that help preserve Scottish heritage and culture in Manitoba.

Mr Speaker, I am so pleased to have Laura and her family, as well as her teacher, Gaelyn, as my guests in the gallery today. I would like to ask that all members of this House join me in congratulating both Laura and Gaelyn for their many accomplishments, to encourage them to continue to contribute to our proud Scottish heritage and to wish them all the best in what I am sure will be many more achievements in the years to come.
