Julia will be travelling to Scotland to perform at the shows throughout the month of August after applying for the team earlier this year.

"I applied for the tattoo in January just by filling out an application form. I was contacted later to send videos of myself dancing to Scotland," said Julia.

The dance team will consist of 66 dancers from countries around the world, including Canada, the United States, Scotland, and Australia.

The shows are performed every day in August, expect for Sundays, and take place in front the Edinburgh castle.

"I am very excited to be a part of the Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo dance team!," she added.

The cards/money have to be returned – otherwise they will cost us money if we cannot account for them all! So please ensure you have turned them in.
- Our spring fundraiser is going to be a 'tag' day during the Mid-Canada competition at the Forks June 6th and 7th. What's a tag day, you ask?
