Manitoba Dancer Impresses In National Poetry Reading Competition

Winnipeg dancer Meaghan Fennell earned a spot in the Poetry in Voice national competition, which is a competition that helps celebrate a youth's passion for poetry.

In this competition, high school students from around the country choose a category they wish to be involved in: English, French or bilingual. Meaghan chose to be in the bilingual stream.

In December, she competed in an in-class competition and was chosen by her teacher to move on to the next stage. Only top 5 scores will move on to the next stage: the school competition.

At the school competition, there is a prompter, 3 judges and an audience. This year, the audience was the grade 11s. Meaghan clinched first place to move on to the next round, online semifinals where she competed against 500 other people.

She was chosen and was granted a free trip to Toronto to compete against the other 11 at the national competition.

She had a lot of fun competing in Toronto and said it was an honour to be chosen even though she didn't make it to the final round.

Kelsey Wog Making Waves On World Swimming Scene



Is it a coincidence that HIghland dancers often seem to excel in areas outside dance? Whether it is another sport, academics or other interests, we celebrate them all! Currently, we are helping the Wog family celebrate with the notoriety their daughter Kelsey has achieved in international swim circles.

We were both amazed and heartbroken by Kelsey Wog's swim in the Olympic trials in Toronto!

She had qualified to swim in four races, broke one of her own personal records and in her specialty event, the 200 metre breaststroke she had both a wonderful and wicked experience. Announced as the "youngster" of the race at age 17, she swam against 9 others who were Pan Am and Olympic-experienced seniors. In the last of 4 lengths of the pool, we were on the edge of our seats watching CBC Sports live, as Kelsey gained on the former-Olympian in second place for a spot on the Olympic team. Her time was faster than needed for the Olympic standard but she also needed to reach the second spot to be heading to Rio! As they neared the finish, the announcer said Kelsey just needed just a bit more real estate to outreach the senior swimmer beside her....you could see she'd been gaining on her in the last stretch! By a fraction of a second Kelsey came in third for a Bronze medal. An amazing feat for our "youngster" from Manitoba, but a fraction short of making the team. Both wonderful to accomplish the best swim of her lifetime, and wickedly heartbreaking all at the same time!

The University of Manitoba Swim program is pumped to have her in their ranks! We are certainly pumped that she remains in our highland dance ranks despite her extreme commitment to swimming at this international level. Kelsey goes on to the Junior Pan-Pacific Championships in Hawaii this summer. She is still considered a "Junior" despite competing with seniors for the Olympic team! Good luck with all your future goals Kelsey!
