### **WINE RAFFLE FUNDRAISER - SPRING 2017**



By now everyone should have received the wine raffle fundraising information from their teachers. Our government funding has been cut and prices keep going up. We need to work together to be able to continue to provide dance opportunities and funding for our dancers.

The MHDA is holding this wine raffle fundraiser to cover our pipers' and judges' fees. Our goal is to be able to provide more piped music next season. Tickets go on sale at the March competition being held at Balmoral Hall on Saturday the 18th of March. The draw is to take place at our Provincial Selection at the St. James Civic Centre on Saturday the 6th of May at 4:00pm. You do not need to be present to win.

There are five prizes of wine baskets available. We are looking for donations of commercially bottled wine, gift certificates or cash to fill our baskets! I know how generous our membership is and have no doubt that we will be able to come up with the 52 bottles of wine that we are looking to raffle off.

For ease of collection, I would like to ask the teacher's participation in the wine donations. If students can be encouraged to bring in their donations to class I can arrange to have either myself or a volunteer pick up at the teacher's request to avoid dancers bringing all donations to the March competition. I can also arrange individual pick up if necessary.

We are encouraging ticket sales by offering the member families who have the top sales \$100.00 and second highest sales will get \$50.00.

Books of tickets can be signed out by at the March and April competitions by providing a post-dated cheque made out to MHDA for May 6th for the value of the tickets taken (\$50/book). # **MHDA Boys Mentorship Program**

MHDA is proud to launch this volunteer program designed to form a brotherhood through the medium of highland dance in Manitoba. It is intended to inspire young male dancers and potential dancers to either take the first step in participating in highland dance or continue to participate in Scottish heritage through dance. There is no fee for participation.

Most importantly, this program is meant to be a support for dancers who are needing a male community of role models. Although highland dance began as a male sport, it is now dominated by females at a ratio of approximately 100:1. This can be a daunting environment, especially for boys entering the tween years.

It is proposed for the group to meet 3 to 4 times per dance year for approximately an hour or so. Kathy Ramesar has graciously offered her studio for the first session. We are currently working on scheduling a date. End of April/early May is being looked at. We also have three male dancers who have committed their time as mentors for this program.

These sessions will begin with the older dancers doing a demonstration for the more inexperienced boys, followed by participation together doing basic movements and exercises. During this interaction, the focus would be on inspiration and participation rather than teaching.

There will be time set aside for question and answer and/or visiting. The younger boys will leave with a small participation award. The older participants will have some time to interact before the end of the session. Parents will be able to visit in a separate area and have an opportunity to discuss costume needs/challenges.

This provides and excellent opportunity for all ages of males to participate in some way. I would suggest a minimum age requirement of 3 for participation.

My personal involvement in this mentorship is related to my son having been the odd man out in highland dance for several years. I enrolled him in ballet at RWB as a support and to find other male dancers for him to socialize with. They have a mentorship program where the principal dancers take time out of their busy schedules to mentor the younger boys and visit with them and it is absolutely inspiring to see how this encourages continued participation. This helps keep the boys dancing into their teens and beyond.

My hope is to provide our current community of males the opportunity to connect and to expand our numbers by inviting family and friends to participate, so spread the word! I have noticed that we have some young male dancers starting out and would like the opportunity to encourage their continued participation through mentorship.

I would encourage all who are interested in the program to contact me to help better prepare for our numbers. We will be circulating a date early in April.

# ScotDance Canada JL McKenzie Scholarship Program

First awarded in 1996 this fund was set up to honour Mr. James L. McKenzie, of Aberdeen Scotland. Mr. McKenzie was instrumental in introducing to, and developing in Canada the techniques of the Scottish Official Board of Highland Dancing.

The intent of the fund is to assist in the development of a promising dancer who displays not only the competitive spirit, but community spirit, as well as a love and enjoyment of, and dedication to Highland Dance. Guidelines for the award have been set to give dancers equal opportunity to win the award. Award winners are encouraged to use the funds to further their dance activities.

Monies for this fund are acquired through donations (provincial or personal). As well, 1% of all ScotDance Canada's portion of dancer registrations collected is allocated to this fund.

The Award is open to Premier dancers who complete the application process, which includes a demonstration of the Tribute to JL McKenzie.

Manitoba is home to six award winners! They are: Tara Christie, George Hamilton, Reagan Robertson, Kaylee Campbell, Kirsten Henry and Stacie Nixon.
