MHDA Changing Stamping Method For Pre-Premiers At Competitions in 2016/17

For this upcoming dance season, the MHDA is going to issue stamps for PrePremier dance cards in a different way than past competitions. We will be moving to the system used for SDCCS 2016. All dancers will continue to be required to show their SOBHD dance card upon registration. However, they will now keep their card with them throughout the competition. At the end of the awards, a station will be set up for all eligible dancers to collect their earned stamps. It will be the responsibility of the dancer (and their parents) to ensure they check in and get the stamp prior to leaving the competition. A tracking sheet will be given to the volunteer issuing stamps. Only eligible dancers will be awarded stamps.

Stamps will be issued according to SOBHD rules:

- * maximum 1 stamp per dancer per competition
- * Beginners may only earn a stamp for a 1st, 2nd or 3rd place in the Highland category only (Fling, Sword, Seann Truibhas and Reel).
- * Novice and Intermediates may earn a stamp for a 1st, 2nd or 3rd place in any dance (National or Highland)

For the second year in a row, a member of the MHDA can call herself Canadian Champion. On July 8, 2016, Laura Unruh won the championship in the 12 and under 14 category. Her sister, Allison Unruh, won the 4th runner up title in the 16 and under 18 category. Other MHDA members (Mya Pilat, Madelaine Baigrie, Jennifer Watt and Alia Cappellani) earned judge's points and placings on this day and details can be found at http://sdccs.ca/assets/2016/07/index1.htm.

These dancers also received recognition on other days of

Notable results include: Taryn Watson winner of 14 and under 16 Nationals Competition; Stacie Nixon winner of 24 and over Nationals Competition; Mya Pilat winner of 10 year old PreChampionship; Jennifer Watt, 2nd runner up in 19 year SDC Open Championship; Julia Domke 4th runner up in 19 year SDC open championship; Lauren McCombe, 4th runner up in 21 and over SDC open championship; Rachel Unruh, 5th runner up in 18 year SDC Open Championship; Allison Unruh, 5th runner up in 16 year SDC Open Championship; Laura Unruh, winner of Premier 12 year Highlands Competition, Winner of 12 and under 15 Heart of Canada Reel Event, Champion in the 12 year SDC Championship.

Laura's dancing accomplishments did not end at SDCCS. Less that a week later, she and her sisters attended the USIR in Michigan. Jennifer Watt was there too. Jennifer Watt was the winner of the 16 and Over solo choreography competition, the 5th runner up in the 18 and under 22 Pearl Magnuson Memorial Premiership, and the 4th runner up in the 18 and over grand Rapids Championship.Laura was the 2nd runner up in the 12 and under premiership and the champion in the 12 and under 14 Championship. Allison was 3rd runner up in the 16 and under 18 Premiership.

Laura had a short break before continuing on to Scotland to compete in the Commonwealth Championship in Sterling where she won the 12 year old Championship. She competed the following weekend at Cowal winning the 12 year old Scottish Championship and qualifying for "worlds" in the juvenile category where she received a 6th place in the sword
